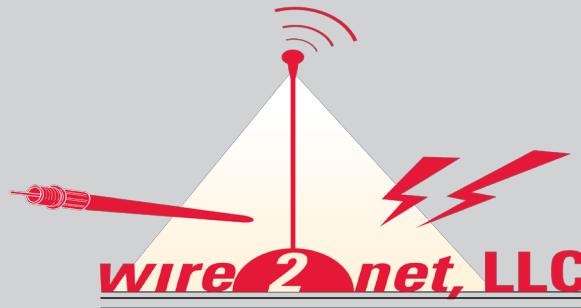

The Federal Aviation Administration's Minority Student Internship Program

The FAA MSI Program enables college students to supplement their academic coursework with study-related work experiences in Aviation and Aerospace facilities nationwide where FAA programs have cooperative agreements or memoranda of understanding. Students placed in a variety of career fields include, but are not limited to, aviation research, flight standards and operations, computer science, engineering (aerospace, computer, civil electronics, electrical, and mechanical), finance, business, legal, and other aviation and transportation studies. Students' career interests, matched with the students' skills, knowledge and abilities, will have career-related work experiences in FAA Headquarters, Regional Offices and or in FAA Regional Centers.

The program helps the FAA maintain its technological edge and mission to provide the safest, most efficient aerospace system in the world. As the agency strives to reach the next level of safety, efficiency, environmental responsibility and global leadership, it knows its people are its strength. The internship program is integral in helping the agency act on its value of strength as its success depends on the respect, diversity, collaboration and commitment of its workforce. With innovation as its signature, the FAA fosters creativity and vision to provide solutions beyond today's boundaries.



Internship Description

The FAA created the Minority Student Internship Program for students from underrepresented groups, who are pursuing studies in the aerospace, engineering and computer science fields.

The goal of the program is two-fold:

1. Gain work experience as a full-time undergraduate or graduate student.
2. Ensure a competitive and diverse workforce for students interested in a career within FAA while offering students opportunities to earn academic credit for their participation in an internship during their internship.

The FAA offers well-qualified, highly motivated students an opportunity to work with seasoned and well-respected aerospace, electrical, mechanical, architectural engineers and computer scientists located at FAA offices and Regional centers across the country. The program runs 10 weeks during the summer; 15 weeks during the fall and spring.

- Describe what you hope to gain from the internship and what you think you can offer
- List courses you have completed that you believe are relevant to the FAA
- List references

Qualifications

- US Citizenship required
- 3.0 GPA or Higher
- Junior, Senior or Graduate Student
- The ability to work well in a team setting; a positive attitude and a basis for action; above average multi-tasking skills; and demonstrated leadership skills

Compensation

The stipend, based on level of experience, varies. The FAA Minority Internship Program will provide travel expenses to and from the host institution. Pre-approval is required.
